

**DUNSTABLE TOWN (0) v HANWELL TOWN (3)**  
**SATURDAY 28TH NOVEMBER 2009**  
**MOLTEN SPARTAN SOUTH MIDLANDS LEAGUE**

We produced arguably our best team performance of the season to convincingly beat Dunstable Town 3-0. In their previous two games, Dunstable had beaten title contenders Royston Town and Aylesbury but on the day there was little dispute that they had been beaten by a better side.

On quite a difficult playing surface and with a gusty wind blowing, Dunstable enjoyed the better of the opening minutes and won three corner kicks in quick succession all of which being very capably dealt with by the safe hands of Berkeley Lawrencein. Dunstable suffered a blow after just ten minutes, when Dan O'Connor limped off to be replaced by Terry Billy. We then began to gain a measure of control of the game, playing some neat football and almost took the lead when Charley Baverstock latched onto a fine through ball by Lee O'Leary and rounded the onrushing Dunstable keeper Paul Taylor, but he lost his balance as he was about to shoot and Dunstable's Luke Flood got back to clear from the goal line. However, in the sixteenth minute we took the lead. An excellent move down the right, culminated in Yassine Fehmi-Gil pulling the ball back into the path of Chris Mills. Chris's shot was well saved by Taylor and Michael Buckley's follow up shot was blocked but the ball was fed back into the path of Chris who curled a superb shot past Taylor into the far top corner of the net. Ten minutes later we should have been two up. Matt Kidson who was showing a welcome return to top form at the heart of our defence, heading Chris's driven corner kick over the bar from point blank range. As the half progressed, Dunstable came more and more into the game and Berkeley had to be alert to make a good save low down to his right after a fine turn and shot from an acute angle by Lee Burgoyne. Minutes later a low cross from the right found Billy completely unmarked on the far post but he completely missed his kick and the chance was gone. The half ended with Chris sending a shot just wide of the far post after he had been set up by Charley.

Early in the second half, Berkeley was again in action saving at his near post from Billy but this was the only save of any significance that he had to make in the half such was our general control. Our second goal came from the penalty spot after a Dunstable defender had handled in the box after a neat free kick movement had given Blaise the space to cross into the goalmouth. Blaise drilled the ball home from the spot. Two minutes from the end of the ninety minutes another good move down the right, involving several players gave Charley the chance to turn the ball into the path of Yassine and he made no mistake, driving the ball into the far corner.
