MOLTEN SPARTAN SOUTH MIDLANDS LEAGUE PREMIER DIVISION.

We finished what has been a disappointing season in some style, producing an excellent display of fluent football to sweep aside Haringey Borough 7-0.

Our final league position of 13th was the lowest that we have finished since the 1994-95 season.

Despite fielding a side that showed five changes from that which had played in the Premier Division Cup Final in mid-week, we produced some excellent football against a Haringey side who had pulled clear of the relegation zone in recent weeks.

We made the perfect start when in the third minute, Wayne Jackson's cross was turned back into the goalmouth by Yassine Fehmi-Gil and Gulad Adan fired home from close range. Rhys Marshall then made a tremendous save to prevent Haringey from equalising whilst at the other end, Brian Sealey did equally well to turn Charley Baverstock's shot over the bar. We went further ahead just after the half hour mark when Sealey was only able to parry Aaron Wise's free kick back into the path of Blaise O'Brien who made no mistake from point blank range. Haringey then had a great chance to reduce the deficit when Gulad Adan was adjudged to have fouled Lee Allen just inside our penalty area but Rhys was up to the task as he dived to his left to turn aside Mario Georgio's penalty kick. Five minutes before the interval, we scored the goal of the game when a flowing movement which saw the ball go from one side of the pitch to the other culminated in Scot Ensom playing the ball into the path of Yassine who's precision cross to the near post was volleyed home by Blaise. Another move involving Yassine who was in terrific form saw us go four ahead when Yassine squared the ball to Wayne who gave Sealey no chance from close range.

The second half was rather a mundane affair with the game effectively over as a contest and it almost became a case of how many we would score. We went five up four minutes into the half when Wayne won the ball in mid field and played it through to Charley who in turn found the unmarked Blaise and Sealey was once again picking the ball out of the net. Charley who made some fine individual runs throughout the game, scored our sixth from close range, triggering off a celebration dance in front of our bench as he scored his first goal since becoming a dad and when Charley was pulled down in the penalty area in the closing minutes, Blaise stepped up to score his fourth of the afternoon and his thirty seventh of the season. Despite, the final score, mention must be made of Rhys Marshall who other than his penalty stage made a couple of other excellent saves to ensure that our season finished with a 'clean sheet'.
